### Cub Scout Courses

- C-1 **Tiger Cub Program-** All you need to know about the Tiger Cub Program plus ideas and fun things to do. **(\$1.00 Fee)**
- C-2 **Engineer & Scientist Activity Badge-** Get tips and ideas to help present these activity badges. Included are ideas on where to find resources and knowledgeable people to help.
- C-3 **Skits, Stunts, Songs & Run-ons-** Make the most of your meetings and keep the boys and their parents interested and involved.
- C-4 **Ceremonies with a Special Touch-** Make advancement special and memorable with great ceremonies that highlight the boy's achievements. Make Pack and Den meetings interesting and special for boys and parents.
- C-5 **Annual Planning & the Pack Budget-** Learn how the annual planning meeting can improve your program. Find out how using the Pack budget can make following the annual program workable.
- C-6 **Crafts-** Learn how crafts can be used as a means of creative expression among your youth. They can also be used for rank advancement and a fun part of the den meeting. **(\$2.00 Fee)**
- C-7 **Storytelling-** Tips and ideas on how to make a story memorable for the boys, their parents, and the leaders.
- C-8 **Cub Scout Knots-** Come and learn how to teach the knots needed for Cub Scout rank advancement. **(\$1.00 Fee)**
- C-9 **Cub Scout Games-** Games help boys to learn sportsmanship, teamwork skills, and following directions. Try some of these!



### Boy Scout Courses

- B-1 **Order of the Arrow in Your Troop-** Service, fun and continued involvement in Scouting. How the OA program can help your troop and retain older Scouts to benefit your program, enliven your ceremonies. How to use your OA Representative.
- B-2 **Merit Badge Counselor-** Assure the boys of the best possible counseling by knowing the appropriate procedures and policies concerning merit badge counseling.
- B-3 **Advanced Knots-** Really "learn the ropes" and what to do with them. **(\$1.00 Fee)**
- B-4 **Life to Eagle-** This session is designed for unit leaders, troop advancement chairs and PARENTS. Understand the "real" meaning of the Eagle Scout rank and what it takes to earn it.
- B-5 **Conducting Troop Boards of Review-** Specific details involved in preparing your members of committee to perform Boards of Review in the troop.
- B-6 **Chaplain's Aide Advisor Training-** This session is for leaders to teach an adult how to train the youth for the Chaplain's Aide position.
- B-7 **The New Scout Orientation-** This session will outline the materials to be covered in the initial meeting of the parent and boy with the Scoutmaster and suggested program of events to encourage timely advancement in rank in the Scout's first year.
- B-8 **Planning the Troop Program-** Discuss the elements for planning the Troop's annual program. This session will encourage the timely evaluation of all activities using the weekly and monthly Patrol Leaders Council meeting.
- B-9 **The Scoutmaster's Conference-** This course will review the requirements and purpose of Scoutmaster's Conferences and explores ways to make the conferences valuable to both the Scout and the Scoutmaster.



### Venturing Courses

- V-1 **How Venturing Can Help a Troop-** The Venturing Program complements the Boy Scout Troop. It adds exciting new advancement and leadership opportunities for your older boys. It allows flexibility, so boys can participate in both programs. Venturing can help solve many of the Scoutmasters challenges. It meets the wants and needs of 14 to 18 year old boys
- V-2 **Venturing Youth Officer Training-** This course provides insights into how to train young adults to fill the leadership positions of the Crew. The course includes discussion of Crew leadership position responsibilities, leadership techniques and skills, planning, and developing young adult's minds to consider other alternatives and consequences.
- V-3 **Here's Venturing-** Provides an introduction to the mission of the Venturing program of the Boy Scouts of America.
- V-4 **Ideal Year of Venturing-** This course will make it easier for your Crew to achieve success by taking you through the steps of planning, budgeting, and communicating your annual plan to members and their families. This course will provide you with the resources to develop your Ideal Year of Venturing with the Crew Committee.



### Special Interest Courses

- S-1 **Webelos-to-Scout Transition-** How important it is to have Webelos and Troop leaders work together to bridge the Webelos Scouts into Boy Scout Troops. How to administer the Webelos program to better prepare the boys for the Boy Scout program.
- S-2 **Special Needs-** This session will help all leaders recognize and handle boys with special needs. Topics will cover ADD and Autism in youth today. Leaders will leave with tips to handle these special situations.
- S-3 **Woodcarving-Beginner-** Back by popular demand. Wise and gifted woodcarvers will show you how to have fun with a block of wood. Bring your own band-aids. (2 period)
- S-4 **Woodcarving-Advanced-** Wise and gifted woodcarvers will show you how to achieve special effects and techniques needed to make an outstanding carving. (2 period)
- S-5 **Leave No Trace--Only Memories-** "Leave nothing but footprints, take nothing but memories" is taken seriously in this course. Get the latest information on an important facet of our outdoor program. The BSA Leave No Trace Award will be discussed during this period.
- S-6 **Effective Communication-** Tips on how to communicate to be understood by others.
- S-7 **Climb On Safely-** This is the Boy Scouts of America's recommended procedure for organizing BSA climbing/rappelling activities at a natural site or a specifically designed facility such as a climbing wall or tower.
- S-8 **GPS-Geo Caching-** Learn the basics and how to use a GPS and Geo-caching device.
- S-9 **Safe Scouting-** This course will be covering the latest "Guide to Safe Scouting." Learn how to use this book as a guideline to plan activities and outings. **(\$4.00 Fee)**
- S-10 **High Adventure Planning-** Many older Scouts consider high adventure the highlight of their outdoor Scouting experiences. High adventure challenges and inspires them—and their leaders—and broadens their appeal for Scouting. This is why Scoutmasters and Advisors must make high-adventure opportunities a priority, promoting participation by unit members.
- S-11 **"IT" Pilot Program-** Learn about how this very structured and advancement focused program for Cub Scout Dens is aimed at youth retention.
- S-12 **Den Chief Training-** Learn how to work with Pack leaders and their dens, to develop skills that motivate young Scouts to Do Their Best, and to help prepare Webelos Scouts for Boy Scouting.

**NOTE:** *The Boy Scout must be 13 years old or have attained First Class rank and have a Den Chief Application signed by the Scoutmaster. He may also attend another course session to aid him in his job as Den Chief.*

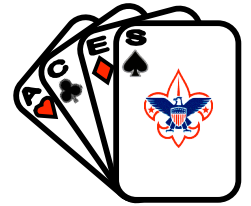

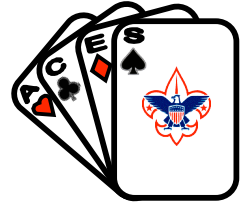

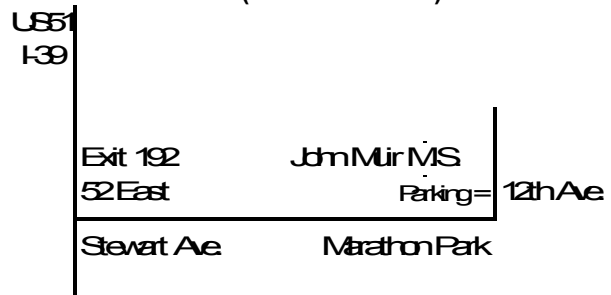
